Forest Park Parade Saturday, March 8, 2014

NOTICE: We recommend you leave cameras, iPads, handbags, or other personal articles at home. While these items are not prohibited, there is no space for you to store them. Volunteers must refrain from drinking alcoholic beverages while performing their assigned duties.

CHECK-IN TIME: NOON (*please arrive promptly*)

LOCATION: O'Sullivan's Public House—[7244 Madison St., Forest Park, IL](#)
Please go to the patio area to meet the campaign organizer.

GETTING THERE: Due to the large crowds, volunteers are encouraged to take public transportation.

ATTIRE: This role consists of a lot of walking outside, so the following attire is suggested:

- Weather appropriate shirt and/or jacket
- Comfortable shoes or sandals
- Loose denim jeans, pants or shorts

MATERIALS: Each volunteer will be given the following:

- Rolls of shamrock stickers
- A green March for Kids apron
- A green March for Kids donation canister

TASKS: When you check in, the campaign organizer will give you a specific place to go along the parade route.

Volunteers will work the streets, sidewalks and bars along the parade route. Volunteers simply pass out shamrock stickers in exchange for donations. Each donation you receive should be placed in the canister.

Anyone assigned to sell shamrocks inside bars, must be at least 21 years old.

SHIFT TIME(S): NOON—3:00pm
The parade begins at 1pm, and unless you have specified otherwise, please expect to volunteer for three (3) hours at this parade.
